Decatur Woman Indicted in Deadly Athens Motorcycle Crash



Athens police say a Decatur woman has been indicted in connection with a July crash that left a 57-year-old man dead.

Officers responded to the intersection of Redfern Drive and Congress Parkway on July 18 following a collision involving a motorcycle. The rider, identified as Phillip Oswalt, was fatally injured at the scene. Investigators later determined that after the initial crash, Oswalt was struck while lying in the roadway by a dark-colored SUV that fled northbound on Congress Parkway.

With the assistance of local businesses, the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation and the FBI, authorities located the suspect vehicle and its driver, 53-year-old Eileen Stapler of Decatur, the same day. Stapler was questioned by police before being released to the custody of the Monroe County Sheriff's Department on unrelated charges.

Following a two-month investigation, the case was presented to the McMinn County Grand Jury on September 16. Jurors returned an indictment charging Stapler with reckless homicide. She was arrested on September 17 without incident, with bond set at \$25,000.

Athens Police Chief Freddy Schultz commended the department's work, calling the case "a great example of building a quality case and then making the arrest." Source: City of Athens Police Department

DRC Printing Celebrates Grand Opening with Ribbon Cutting





Tennessee Unemployment Holds Steady as Job Growth Continues



Tennessee's unemployment rate remained steady at 3.6% in August, well below the national rate of 4.3%. The state added 9,500 jobs between July and August, with the largest gains in transportation, warehousing, retail trade, and construction. Over the past year, Tennessee employers have added 34,400 jobs, led by government, professional and business services, and leisure and hospitality. September is recognized as Workforce Development Month, highlighting the programs and partnerships that strengthen Tennessee's workforce. County-level unemployment data will be released on September 25.

Aguilar's Record-Tying Night Sets Tone as Vols Eye UAB and Beyond



Tennessee may have fallen short against Georgia, but the Vols left last weekend's clash with plenty to build on. In a 44-41 overtime defeat, quarterback Joey Aguilar put together a record-tying performance inside Neyland Stadium, throwing for 371 yards and four touchdowns while adding a rushing score. He became the first Tennessee quarterback since Peyton Manning to post those numbers against a ranked opponent.

The offensive fireworks didn't stop there. Redshirt junior wideout Chris Brazzell II continued his breakout season with 177 receiving yards and three touchdowns, includ-

ing a 72-yard strike that electrified the sellout crowd. Tennessee finished with nearly 500 yards of total offense, showing the kind of balance and explosiveness needed for the long SEC stretch ahead.

Now the Vols shift to Week 4, when UAB comes to Neyland Stadium for a 12:45 p.m. kickoff on SEC Network. Tennessee is 5-0 all-time against the Blazers, with the last meeting in 2019, but Saturday's game carries more importance than just maintaining an unbeaten record in the series. Along with the following week's contest against Mississippi State, these matchups give Tennessee a chance to fine-tune its offense and shore up defensive issues before a brutal stretch that includes road trips to Arkansas on October 11 and Alabama on October 18, following a bye on October 4.

That looming slate will help determine whether the Vols remain in the College Football Playoff race, but first things first: Tennessee must take care of business against UAB. Every game matters, and this weekend's contest offers a chance not only to get back in the win column but to keep building momentum — with full focus on the task at hand.
