TBI Investigating Death of Madisonville Man Following Confrontation with Officers



The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) is reviewing an incident that led to the death of a Madisonville man following an encounter with law enforcement on Sunday, October 5.


According to Monroe County Sheriff Tommy Jones, Madisonville Police Officer Jimmy Haynes was traveling to begin his shift around 5:18 p.m. when he came upon several vehicles stopped near the intersection of Turnpike Road and New Highway 68. Bystanders directed the officer's attention to a white Ford F-150 truck partially blocking the roadway, saying the driver might be in distress.

Officer Haynes activated his emergency lights and approached the driver, later identified as **62-year-old Michael Ray Stice of Madisonville**, who appeared disoriented and unresponsive to questions. When asked to place the vehicle in park, Stice initially refused before eventually complying. After the officer requested Stice to exit the vehicle, he refused and reached inside the truck, prompting Haynes to draw his weapon and issue verbal commands.

Monroe County deputies Todd Bible and Sgt. Bobby Queen arrived shortly after to assist. Stice fled on foot, and deputies pursued him. Multiple Taser deployments were made, but Stice reportedly continued to resist arrest. After a brief struggle, deputies were able to place him in handcuffs. Deputies then noticed that Stice was unresponsive and turning blue. They began CPR and continued life-saving efforts until Monroe County EMS arrived. Stice was transported to Sweetwater Hospital, where he was later pronounced dead.

A search of Stice's vehicle and clothing revealed a white powdery substance believed to be fentanyl, along with a scale. Sher iff Jones stated that preliminary findings suggest Stice may have suffered a drug overdose. Stice was known to law enforcement and the Tenth Judicial Drug Task Force from previous encounters related to fentanyl use and trafficking.

Sheriff Jones emphasized the importance of allowing the TBI's independent investigation to proceed without speculation or mis information, noting that the agency will release officer body camera footage and other relevant materials once the investigation is complete. "Our commitment remains to transparency, accountability, and justice—based on evidence and facts, not assumptions and rumors," Jones said in a state-ment.



Pedestrian Injured, Driver Arrested After Hit-and-Run in Etowah



A pedestrian was struck by a pickup truck Tuesday morning on County Road 890 near Starr Bethel Baptist Church in Etowah. The incident occurred around 9 a.m. when the truck came around a curve and hit the pedestrian before stopping briefly to let out a passenger, then fleeing the scene

First responders from Etowah Rural Fire, Etowah City Fire, and Englewood Rural Fire Departments, along with McMinn County Sheriff's deputies and AMR, arrived on scene. The pedestrian was treated at the scene and transported by AMR to the University of Tennessee Medical Center in Knoxville. The driver was later involved in a crash in Tellico Plains, where he was taken into custody by Tennessee Highway Patrol Trooper Travis Ryans, who is also leading the investigation. 
