Great American Smokeout Highlights Ongoing Tobacco Risks in Tennessee




Cancer patients, survivors, and advocates across Tennessee are marking the American Cancer Society's 49th annual Great American Smokeout on Thursday, November 20, urging elected officials to take stronger action to reduce tobacco use. The observance encourages people who smoke or use any form of tobacco—including e-cigarettes and nicotine pouches—to create a plan to quit.

Tobacco use remains the leading preventable cause of disease and death in Tennessee. Smoking is linked to at least 12 types of cancer, including lung, liver, and colorectal cancer, and more than 11,400 Tennesseans die each year from smoking-related illnesses. Despite these well-documented risks, CDC data show that 17% of adults in the state continue to smoke. Officials note that tobacco products are highly addictive, making quitting extremely difficult once regular use begins.

Advocacy groups point to concerning youth trends as well. Tennessee high school students use e-cigarettes at nearly three times the national average, underscoring the need for prevention programs that reduce initiation and support individuals who are already addicted.

Research consistently shows that strong tobacco control policies are effective in reducing tobacco use. With the closure of the federal Office of Smoking and Health following CDC budget cuts earlier this year, state-level funding and support are considered more crucial than ever. The American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network (ACS CAN) is urging lawmakers to fund and protect evidence-based tobacco control programs, emphasizing that fewer tobacco users will result in reduced suffering, illness, and death from tobacco-related diseases.

Free quitting resources are available through the American Cancer Society's **Empowered to Quit** program and the **Tennessee Tobacco Quitline**.

Athens City Council Accepting Applications for Vacant City Council Position

The Athens City Council is accepting applications for the vacant city council position created by the resignation of Dr. Dick Pelley. This position will fill the vacancy until the next election on the third Tuesday in November 2026. All interested parties are encouraged to submit an application by the deadline of Monday, December 1, 2025 at 5:00 p.m. Eligibility requirements and applications are available on the city's website at www.athenstn.gov, at Athens City Hall, or by email admin@athenstn.gov. Applications can be submitted to the Office of the City Manager, City of Athens, TN, 815 N. Jackson Street, Athens, TN 37303 during normal office hours of Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. prior to the deadline.

The City Council will conduct a special-called meeting on Thursday, December 4, 2025 at noon at City Hall, 815 N. Jackson Street, to review the submitted applications, appoint a candidate, and the candidate will be sworn in at that time to participate in the December 8, 2025 work session.

Living Heritage Museum Launches Front-Landscape Revitalization Project



The McMinn County Living Heritage Museum has begun a major front-landscape revitalization project, supported by \$4,900 in community funding. The effort replaces decades-old, overgrown shrubs that had obscured the museum's historic façade with colorful, low-maintenance flowering plants and native-friendly shrubs designed to create a more welcoming entrance for visitors, school groups, and event attendees.

The project was fully funded through three contributions: a \$1,900 gift from the Kanunsita Garden Club of Athens, a \$1,000 grant to the club from the Tennessee Federation of Garden Clubs, and a \$2,000 personal donation from Museum Trustee and longtime community supporter Susan Buttram.

Founded in 1926, the Tennessee Federation of Garden Clubs (TFGC) brings to-


gether more than 250 clubs statewide to promote gardening education, floral design, conservation, civic beautification, historic preservation, and native plant stewardship. The organization is a charter member of National Garden Clubs, Inc.

Kanunsita Garden Club President Martha Culvahouse said the group is grateful for the Endowment Trust Fund grant that supported the effort, adding that the museum "is the heart of McMinn County's history."

Museum Director Brett King said the transformation reflects a shared commitment to preserving Athens' heritage and enhancing the visitor experience.

The Living Heritage Museum is located at 522 West Madison Avenue in Athens and is open Tuesday–Friday, 10 a.m.–5 p.m., and Saturday, 10 a.m.–4 p.m.
