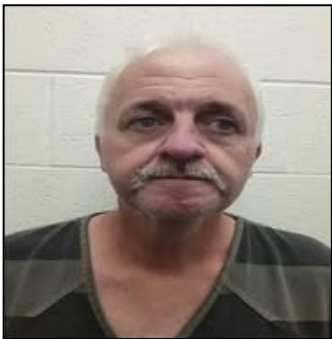

Athens Area Council for the Arts Announces Full Summer Camp Lineup



The Athens Area Council for the Arts has opened registration for its 2026 Summer Arts Camps, offering a range of programs for students from kindergarten through high school at The Arts Center.

The season begins with the 29th annual **Kids Arts Camp**, scheduled for June 1–5 and June 8–12 for grades K–6. Campers will participate in daily classes in art, music, drama, and dance, with each session ending in a live performance. Tuition is \$125, with a May 18 registration deadline.

Jr. Musical Theatre Camp will follow June 15–26 for grades 1–6, culminating in a staged production of *Finding Nemo KIDS*. The camp runs weekdays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., with performances planned at the end of the session. Tuition is \$250, and registration closes June 1.

Youth Theatre Camp, set for July 6–17, is designed for ages 11–17 and offers a two-week intensive focused on acting, stage movement, and music. The program concludes with a performance of an original musical. Tuition is \$300, with registration due June 22.

Visual Arts Mini Camp (July 20–24) will provide hands-on workshops for grades K–5, while a new “*Make Your Mark*” camp (July 27–31) for grades 6–12 will focus on studying master artists and creating original work. Tuition for these camps ranges from \$75 to \$80.

Organizers say need-based scholarships are available for select camps through the Marian Biddle Trew Scholarship Fund. The scholarship application is available upon request from The Arts Center. Visit in-person, call 423-745-8781, or email artsed@athensartscouncil.org for scholarship applications. Scholarships are given on a first-come, first-served basis, so do not delay.

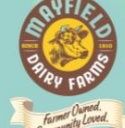

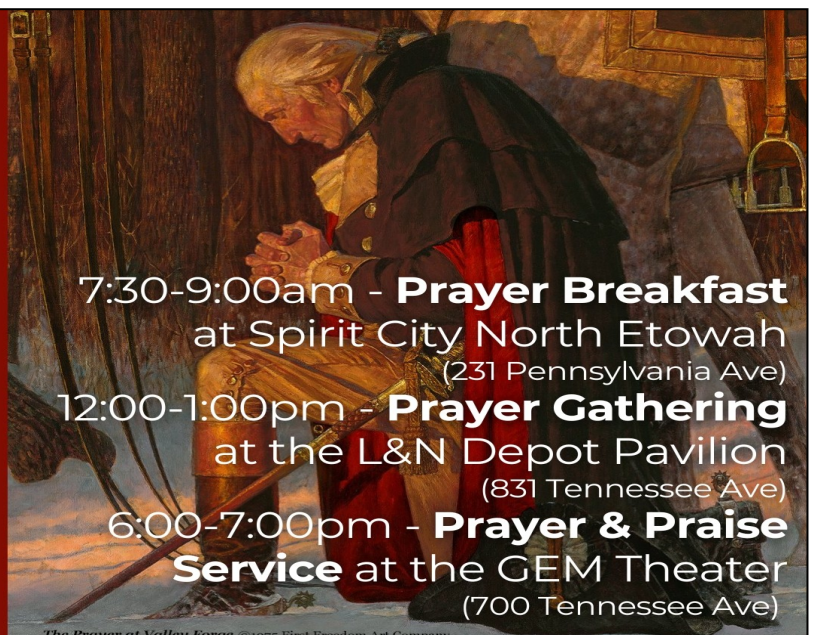

Splash Pad Opens Today at Athens Regional Park; Ingleside Pool Opens Later This Month



Families looking to cool off this summer can now enjoy the splash pad at Athens Regional Park, which officially opens today for the season. The free attraction, operated by the Athens Tennessee Parks & Recreation Department, will be open daily from 10 a.m.

to 8 p.m.

The splash pad has become a popular warm-weather destination for local families, offering interactive water features, open play space, and nearby pavilion rentals for birthday parties and gatherings. Pavilion rentals in the splash pad and playground area begin at \$30 for two hours.

Meanwhile, Ingleside Pool is scheduled to open May 23. Pool hours will be Monday through Saturday from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sundays from 2 to 5 p.m. Admission is \$4 for youth under 18 and seniors age 55 and older, and \$5 for adults.
