Etowah Chosen for Downtown Redevelopment Pilot Program



Etowah has been selected as one of 10 Tennessee Main Street communities to participate in a new Real Estate Development Pilot Program aimed at revitalizing downtown properties and encouraging private investment.

The program will provide Etowah with professional real estate analysis, development expertise and property-specific planning to identify opportunities for vacant and underused downtown buildings. Etowah Tennessee Main Street will partner with Place + Main Advisors, LLC, which has been contracted by Tennessee Main Street to conduct an in-depth assessment of the local downtown real estate market.

As part of the program, consultants will prepare development recommendations and six individual reports for priority properties, outlining strategies to attract developers and make redevelopment projects financially viable.

Following the assessment, a state consultant will work with Etowah Tennessee Main Street, city officials, property owners, developers and community partners to help implement the recommendations.

LeBron Fowler, executive director of Etowah Tennessee Main Street, said the selection is a significant opportunity for the community and reflects confidence in the future of downtown Etowah. Fowler said the city's historic buildings and distinctive character provide a strong foundation for growth, adding that the program will help identify what is needed to attract new investment and move redevelopment projects forward. He also noted that the initiative is about more than restoring buildings, saying it has the potential to create new business opportunities, generate jobs and strengthen downtown for future generations.

According to Etowah Tennessee Main Street, the pilot program represents another step in the city's ongoing efforts to preserve and revitalize its historic downtown while supporting long-term economic development.

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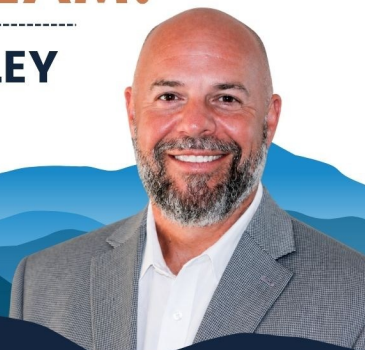

Tennessee Man Killed in Monroe County Crash Identified



The Tennessee Highway Patrol has identified the man who died in a single-vehicle crash Wednesday in Monroe County as 24-year-old Isaac Self of Tennessee.

According to a preliminary THP report, Self was driving a truck north on Highway 360 near Bill Moser Road when the vehicle left the roadway at approximately 11:28 a.m.

Troopers said the truck traveled onto the grass shoulder on the right side of the road, struck a tree and then went down an embankment before coming to rest on its left side in a lake.

Self died as a result of the crash. The incident remains under investigation by the Tennessee Highway Patrol.

Street Closures Planned for Athens Travelers Car Club Cruise-In

Motorists should plan for temporary road closures in downtown Athens on Saturday, Sept. 19, as the Athens Travelers Car Club Cruise-In returns to the city.

According to the Athens Public Works Department, portions of Jackson Street and Madison Avenue will be closed from 2 to 7 p.m. to accommodate the event.

The affected areas include Jackson Street between Green Street and Washington Avenue, and Madison Avenue between White Street and Green Street.

City officials are advising drivers to use caution in the area and watch for traffic signs, workers and pedestrians. Motorists should also allow extra travel time due to expected delays and detours around the event.

The street closures are being implemented to provide space for the annual cruise-in, which typically brings classic vehicles and spectators to downtown Athens.

AACA to Feature Three Exhibits This Fall

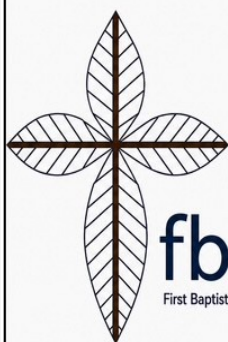


The Athens Area Council for the Arts will host three exhibitions at The Arts Center from Sept. 25 through Oct. 30, highlighted by the annual **Open Exhibit and Art Show**, a juried competition featuring artists from McMinn and surrounding counties. This year's exhibit celebrates America's 250th anniversary, inviting artists to explore the nation's history, culture and ideals through visual art. Chattanooga artist Adam Romano will serve as the competition judge.

Romano will also present his solo exhibit, **American Witches**, on the Gallery Wall in the Peggy Dow Performance Center. The collection examines the legacy of the 1692 Salem Witch Trials through portraiture and contemporary imagery, exploring how societies create and treat outsiders. Romano is an award-winning fine artist whose work has appeared in galleries, museums and exhibitions across the country.

Also featured will be **Threads of Resistance, Stitches of Hope**, a textile art exhibit by the artist collective Resist-Stitch. Using quilting and needlework traditions, the group explores themes of democracy, community, justice and hope. The exhibit reflects on American values and encourages viewers to consider the role of civic engagement and collaboration in shaping the future.

All three exhibits will be on display through Oct. 30. A combined reception and awards ceremony is scheduled for 5 p.m. Friday, Oct. 2, at The Arts Center. Gallery hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, and during special events.

Athens Fire Department Receives \$35,615 State Grant for Rescue Equipment

The Athens Fire Department has received a \$35,615 grant from the Tennessee State Fire Marshal's Office to help strengthen the department's emergency response capabilities.

According to city officials, the funding was used to purchase new extrication tools for firefighters. The equipment will be used during vehicle rescue operations, allowing crews to more safely and effectively remove victims trapped in wrecked vehicles.

Fire officials said the upgraded tools will enhance the department's ability to respond to motor vehicle crashes and other emergencies requiring specialized rescue equipment.

The grant represents an investment in public safety and emergency preparedness, providing Athens firefighters with updated resources to better serve the community.
